The Woodland Assistant will support the Woodland Manager and the team of Foresters with the project of regenerating, restructuring and developing Dronley Wood and other local woodlands across Angus towards site-adapted, diverse, stable and resilient mixed woodlands.

Role Overview:

We are looking for an enthusiastic, committed and motivated individual who can help our team prepare and implement continuous cover forestry principles at Dronley Community Woodland and in other local woodlands involved in the Angus Climate Hub. The woodland assistant will have the opportunity to get involved in many aspects of Continuous Cover Forestry like monitoring, surveying, silvicultural planning, marking thinnings, planning and implementing events, meeting landowners, weeding, collecting seeds, direct seeding, tree planting and chainsaw work. This rewarding role also includes working with our very dedicated group of volunteers. The woodland assistant will be based at Dronley Community Woodland and other local woodlands across Angus. The part-time position as a woodland assistant is a fantastic opportunity to develop skills and knowledge in Continuous Cover Forestry and to learn about the essential role of ecological woodland management in mitigating the effects of climate change.

About Dronley Community Woodland and Angus Climate Hub:

Dronley Community Woodland (Area: 50 ha) is close to Dundee and very popular with walkers, runners, cyclists, and horse riders. We have more than 20,000 visits per year. Dronley Wood offers local employment, volunteering opportunities, school visits, courses, and cooperation with local woodland owners and other local organizations. Dronley Community Woodland is committed to creating a long-lasting legacy for the local community. We manage Dronley Wood as a multi-purpose woodland where community access, biodiversity, timber production and recreation value are equal priorities. We aim to develop Dronley Wood into a site-adapted, diverse, stable, resilient mixed woodland that can produce valuable timber for future generations. The woodland management of Dronley Wood is carried out according to ecological processes using low-impact woodland management strategies. This kind of woodland management is called Continuous Cover Forestry (=

Ecological Woodland Management). Continuous Cover Forestry is essential for mitigating the effects of climate change. Dronley Community Woodland is part of the Angus Climate Hub. We want to inspire, encourage and help other local woodland owners to manage and develop their woodlands according to Continuous Cover Forestry Principles for the benefit of future generations.

Key duties and responsibilities:

- To assist our team of foresters with tree felling, snedding, extracting and forwarding
- To assist with surveying and monitoring individual woodland stands
- To assist with silvicultural planning and marking thinnings
- To help with organizing, preparing and running volunteer days, school visits and community engagement events
- To assist with and, after training, carry out and lead Seed Collecting, Direct Seeding, Deer Fencing and Tree Planting Projects- following good practice and risk assessment
- To work with partner organisations and landowners in developing suitable woodland management strategies
- To work flexibly and to undertake any other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned from time to time
- To carry out duties with full regard to all Health and Safety Policies and risk assessments
- To travel around Angus using your transport as required
